

HOTELS IN ICELAND

SKUGGI HOTEL, REYKJAVÍK



Centrally located to easily discover downtown Reykjavík, the hotel has a bar. There is no restaurant, but good restaurants are close-by. The en-suite rooms are comfortable with a minimalist style.

Iceland is a destination unlike any other in Europe. With its black sand beaches, spectacular waterfalls, geothermal lagoons, glistening glaciers, ice-covered volcanoes and qushing geysers, it is the perfect destination for nature lovers.

Start your adventure in Reykjavík, the world's northernmost capital. Stroll through the lively city centre, where there are many museums, cosy cafés and traditional restaurants. After enjoying the comforts of this small city, embark on an epic road journey around the island following Iceland's ring road, with stunning landscapes scattered on the 1,000-mile loop. Each section of the journey is different, with incredible waterfalls, volcanoes, glaciers, forests, barren deserts,

mountains, geysers and fjords all visible from the vehicle. With 30 active volcano systems, this harsh natural environment has resulted in Iceland being a hotbed for geothermal activity and geological formations. Despite these conditions, there is still an abundance of wildlife, and it is possible to spot whales, dolphins and seals on boat trips from the north coast. As the most sparsely populated country in Europe, you will pass small fishing communities, traditional turf houses and vast farms full of beautiful Icelandic horses and sheep.

This tour allows you to get the full picture of Iceland by travelling the full circle during the long days of the summer months, the best time to experience the wild outdoors.

Day 1 (Thu) Reykjavík Fly from the UK to Reykjavík

where you are taken to your hotel. Free afternoon to explore this fascinating city (1 night).

Day 2 (Fri) Reykjavík - Akureyri Head north on the scenic journey to Akureyri. Stop at the Grábrók volcano and walk to the top of the 170-metre high crater. There will be time for lunch in the fishing village of Hvammstangi before continuing to the Glaumbaer Farm & Museum, known for its well-preserved turf houses. Arrive in Akureyri in the late afternoon and take the optional Akureyri Whale Watching excursion (1 night).

Day 3 (Sat) Akurevri - Lake Mývatn Depart Akurevri, stopping at the impressive Godafoss waterfall, then continue towards the Lake Mývatn area, where you spend the day exploring the surrounding lava fields, lake shore, caves and volcanic craters. In the late afternoon take the optional Myvatn Nature Baths excursion to soak in idyllic hot springs (1 night).

Day 4 (Sun) Lake Mývatn - Egilsstadir On your journey east, stop at the Hverir geothermal area and Dettifoss, the most powerful waterfall in Europe. Then cross the Icelandic desert, continuing to Studlagil, a beautiful canyon known for its tall basalt rock columns. Arrive at your hotel in Egilsstadir on a beautiful forested lake shore in the late afternoon (1 night).

Day 5 (Mon) Egilsstadir - Glacier Lagoon Journey to the southern coast, passing calm fjords, spectacular waterfalls and harbour villages on the way, and visit Stokksnes, an impressive headland of black sand dunes. End the day's journey at the Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon, filled with icebergs that have broken free from the mighty Breidamerkurjökull, an outlet glacier of

ITINERARY

Europe's largest ice cap. Walk along Diamond Beach and marvel at the glistening icebergs that wash up on the jet-black sand shore. It is sometimes possible to spot seals relaxing on the smaller icebergs or swimming in the lagoon. For the more adventurous, take the optional Glacier Lagoon Zodiac Ride excursion to get up close to the face of the glacier (1 night).

Day 6 (Tue) Glacier Lagoon - Vík Drive along the south coast to Skaftafell National Park and walk to Svartifoss waterfall. Then, continue to possibly the most beautiful beach in Iceland, Reynisfjara, where the long black beach contrasts with dramatic cliffs, caves and sea arches. Continue to the Dyrhólaey peninsula, famous for its incredible views of Iceland's south coast and abundance of bird-life. From May to August, it is possible to spot Atlantic puffins nesting on the cliff faces. In the afternoon, check-in to your hotel in Vík, the southernmost village on the island (1 night).

Day 7 (Wed) Vik - Reykjavik Take the final leg back to Reykjavík, starting with two of Iceland's most impressive waterfalls: Skógafoss and Seljalandsfoss. Then start the famous Golden Circle route by exploring the Geysir geothermal area, where the Strokkur geyser normally erupts every ten minutes. Continue to the last waterfall of the trip, the spectacular Gullfoss, before driving through Thingvellir National Park which boasts a fascinating combination of Icelandic history and natural beauty. Return to Reykjavík in the evening for your last night in Iceland (1 night).

Day 8 (Thu) Transfer to Keflavík airport for your return flight to the UK.

AKUREYRI WHALE WATCHING

Akureyri lies at the bottom of the Eyjafjörður fjord, and its bay is one of the best places in Europe for whale watching. It is often possible to spot humpback, minke and bottlenose whales, as well as harbour porpoise and white beaked dolphins on a three-hour boat ride from Akureyri harbour. On board is a specially trained whale watching guide who is an expert at spotting the whales and explaining their behaviours.

MÝVATN NATURE BATHS

The Mývatn Nature Baths are a set of geothermally heated pools and steam baths overlooking the stunning volcanic landscape. After a day of walking on lava fields and volcanic cones, soak your weary muscles in soothing milky-blue geothermal waters for a couple of hours. The warm water contains a unique blend of minerals, particularly sulphur, which is said to be good for skin and respiratory problems.

HOTELS IN SICILY

GRAND HOTEL VILLA POLITI, SYRACUSE



This historic hotel is located close to Syracuse's seafront. Used as a wartime base by Churchill, it also sits on one of Sicily's oldest archaeological sites. There is a swimming pool, two restaurants and two bars. En-suite rooms are air conditioned

HOTEL BAIA DI ULISSE, AGRIGENTO



Set inside a cool pine forest, this hotel has access to a private beach, a swimming pool and two restaurants. Rooms are ensuite and air conditioned with plenty of natural light. Dinner is included.

HOTEL PLAZA OPERA, PALERMO



Located in the historic heart of Palermo, the hotel does not have its own restaurant, but there are good restaurants nearby. There is a panoramic rooftop terrace and bar. En-suite rooms are air conditioned.

SANT ALPHIO GARDEN & SPA. **GIARDINI NAXOS**



Boasting views of Taormina and Mount Etna, this hotel is a 5-minute walk from a fine-sand beach. The hotel has a restaurant, large swimming pool, spa and fitness room. En-suite rooms are spacious, comfortable and air conditioned.

TREASURES OF SICILY

SYRACUSE AGRIGENTO PALERMO GIARDINI NAXOS MOUNT ETNA 8 DAYS / 7 NIGHTS FROM £1849



o is full of a striking mix of Arab and Normal architecture, giving the city a unique fe

Sicily is an island of superlatives. The finest Greek temples anywhere, the best preserved and most extensive Roman mosaics, the highest and most active volcano in Europe and, of course, the best ice cream in the world!

Sicily is bursting at the seams with architectural gems. For more than 3,000 years, a myriad of civilisations have discovered, conquered and made their mark on the island. In the north, Palermo and Monreale are teeming with Arabic domes and arches, Byzantine mosaics and Norman cathedrals, while the towns of Erice and Castelbuono boast evocative remains of Arab and Norman castles. In the southeast,

Day 1 (Sun) Syracuse Fly from the UK to Catania, where you are met and take a one-hour transfer to your hotel in Syracuse (2 nights).

Day 2 (Mon) Syracuse Morning tour of the Neapolis Archaeological Park to see the well-preserved Greek and Roman theatres. The Greek theatre is one of the largest ever built; its 67 rows could accommodate up to 15,000 spectators. Head to the small island of Ortigia, Syracuse's ancient heart. Admire the unique Cathedral of Syracuse, with its original Greek columns incorporated into a Baroque façade, and visit the Temple of Apollo, the oldest Doric temple in Sicily. In the afternoon, visit Noto, the capital of Sicilian Baroque architecture. Admire the stunning Noto Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and wander down Corso Vittorio Emanuele, Noto's main street, strolling past magnificent churches, beautiful buildings, restaurants and shops. Return to Syracuse in the early evening.

Day 3 (Tue) Syracuse - Agrigento Depart Syracuse crossing the interior of Sicily. Stop at the Villa Romana del Casale outside Piazza Armerina, home to the finest mosaics anywhere in the Roman world. Marvel at the impressive Ambulatory of the Big Hunt, a 60-metre long mosaic telling the story of the Roman Venatio. After a three-course lunch, continue to the Valley of the Temples outside Agrigento. The park consists of seven Doric temples built between 510 BC and 430 BC and is one of the most extensive sites of classical Greek civilisation. Admire the Temple of Concordia, the largest and best-preserved Doric temple in the world. In the evening check in to your hotel (1 night).

there is an array of Baroque masterpieces, including the golden-hued churches and buildings of Noto.

The Greeks and the Romans were an integral part to Sicily's early history and as a result, they established a number of important cities which are now archaeological sites. The most important Greek city was Syracuse and is home to a number of well-preserved Greek and Roman ruins. On a ridge near the town of Agrigento are the ruins of a 6th century Greek city, Akragas. Still remaining are seven Doric temples, now known as the Valley of the Temples. Outside Piazza Armerina is Villa Romana del Casale, home to the best collection of mosaic floors anywhere in the Roman world.

ITINERARY

Day 4 (Wed) Agrigento - Palermo Leave southern Sicily behind as you journey north. Stop at the Temple of Segesta, a well-preserved Greek structure in beautiful rolling hills. Continue to the medieval hilltop town of Erice for lunch. Visit the 12th century Norman Venus Castle, boasting stunning views over the sparkling blue coast. Arrive into Sicily's capital city Palermo in the evening (2 nights).

Day 5 (Thu) Palermo Morning walking tour of Palermo. Wander the colourful souk-like markets, old streets and alleyways learning about the capital. After centuries of foreign rulers, Palermo's quilted history is evident in the vast range of architectural styles, namely Byzantine, Arabic, Barogue and Norman. Visit the impressive UNESCOlisted Palermo Cathedral, with its Roman columns, Gothic portico and Islamic engravings. In the afternoon, take the optional Monreale Cathedral excursion.

Day 6 (Fri) Palermo - Giardini Naxos Follow the north coast, visiting the charming medieval hill town of Castelbuono, known for its imposing castle and picturesque setting. Pass the Strait of Messina, with mainland Italy only two miles away, then continue on the beautiful coastline until you reach the seaside town of Giardini Naxos in the evening (2 nights).

Day 7 (Sat) Giardini Naxos Spend the day at leisure, perhaps relaxing on one of Giardini Naxos' beaches or take a short bus ride to the small town of Taormina. Alternatively, take the optional Mount Etna & Wine Tasting excursion.

Day 8 (Sun) Take a one-hour transfer to Catania airport for your return flight to the UK.

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS

MONREALE CATHEDRAL

30 minutes from Palermo is the hilltop town of Monreale. This half-day afternoon excursion includes a guided visit of the stunning Cathedral of Monreale, arguably the finest example of Arab-Byzantine-Norman architecture in Sicily. The interior is jaw dropping, with over 6,500m² of swirling golden mosaics made with 2,200kg of pure gold. Admire the waves of glistening gold in the famous Byzantine style. Also visit the Benedictine monastery and walk around the cloister, admiring the 200 intricately carved marble columns. Return to Palermo in the early evening.

MOUNT ETNA & WINE TASTING

The highest volcano in Europe and among the most active in the world, Mount Etna dominates Sicily with its size and stature. On this full-day excursion, drive up Etna's slopes to 1,900 metres, passing by lava flows and extinct craters. Take a guided walk and enjoy sweeping views of the landscapes, characterised by black dunes and expanses of solidified lava. Descend the mountain and visit the Barone di Villagrande vineyard on Etna's eastern slopes. Learn about the production of Etnean wine, followed by tasting of 4 wines and an excellent fourcourse lunch. Return to Giardini Naxos in the afternoon.

HOTEL PARK, LAKE BLED

LAKE BLED PORTOROŽ ADRIATIC COAST LJUBLJANA 7 DAYS / 6 NIGHTS FROM £1299

Nestled in the heart of Europe, this small country offers an incredible array of unforgettable experiences. Admire the beauty of Lake Bled and Lake Bohinj, surrounded by pristine forests. Walk along river canyons with vibrant turquoise waters flowing from the meltwater of the snow-capped Julian Alps above. Discover castles with dramatic views and historic churches.

Continue to the Adriatic Coast, exploring one of

Europe's most impressive cave systems on the way. Then wander the charming streets of the ancient Venetian port city of Piran steeped in history and tradition, before ending in the country's capital, Ljubljana, with picturesque squares, ornate bridges and a laid-back cafe-culture vibe. On this holiday you will witness natural beauty, unique culture and rich history in abundance.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Sun) Lake Bled Fly from the UK to Slovenia, where you are met and transferred to your hotel on the shores of Lake Bled (3 nights).

Day 2 (Mon) Lake Bled Begin by taking a short transfer to the start of an easy 90-minute walk along the beautiful Vintgar Gorge, passing waterfalls and alpine villages on your way. Return to Lake Bled to visit the iconic Bled Castle built on the massif overlooking the lake, before descending to the shores of the lake itself to take a traditional Slovenian boat to the island in the centre of the lake to visit the famous church where you can ring the bell. Afternoon free. Perhaps walk a loop of the lake, taking in the panoramic view from Mala Ojstrica.

Day 3 (Tue) Lake Bled Take the optional Lake Bohinj Hike excursion. Alternatively, spend time at Lake Bled. Perhaps take a refreshing dip in the cool waters, hire a bike to explore the beautiful surroundings or enjoy a traditional Slovenian pastry at a lakeside cafe.

Day 4 (Wed) Lake Bled - Portorož Take a 90-minute journey to the impressively constructed Predjama Castle, built into a cliff cave. Continue to the Postojna Cave system and take an underground train then explore the vast network on foot and marvel at the unique subterranean formations. Enjoy lunch (included) before continuing to the coastal town of Portorož on the Adriatic coast, arriving in the late afternoon (2 nights).

Day 5 (Thu) Portorož Free day in Portorož. Perhaps spend the day relaxing in the seaside town, or take a pleasant one-hour walk following the coast to the Venetian port of Piran. A 10-minute bus is also available. Wander the narrow, winding streets of the old town or walk the

cobbled street to the hilltop Cathedral of St George with good views over the peninsula. Enjoy fresh seafood at one of the restaurants located along the promenade overlooking the Adriatic Sea.

Day 6 (Fri) Ljubljana Take a 90-minute transfer to the charming capital city of Ljubljana. In the afternoon, take a tour strolling through the medieval old town and marvel at the architectural feats before ascending to Ljubljana Castle by funicular to take in the beautiful panoramic views of the city. Your tour ends with a visit to the bustling central market. You then have free time to further explore the city and perhaps enjoy an evening dining alongside the Ljubljanica River (1 night).

Day 7 (Sat) Transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK.

OPTIONAL EXCURSION

LAKE BOHINJ HIKE

This excursion takes you to the largest of Slovenia's glacial lakes, Lake Bohinj, located a 30-minute drive from Lake Bled. The hike takes you on a full circuit of the lake beginning on the south shore, through dense forests. You will then descend to the west side of the lake, before crossing the emerald green Savica River to the northern shore. The hike ends at the beautifully located Church of St John the Baptist on the edge of the crystalline waters, where lunch is included at a local restaurant. The full hike takes approximately four hours and is moderate in difficulty, traversing forest trails and rocky terrain. You have free time to wander the village or perhaps take a refreshing swim in the waters of the lake, before returning to Lake Bled.

Arguably the most iconic image of Slovenia is that of Lake Bled island, with its spired church standing proud in the centre of the glacial lake surrounded by dramatic mountainous scenery and thick wooded forests. The Church, dedicated to the Assumption of Mary, was constructed in the late 15th century and is decorated with intricate frescoes. Wedding ceremonies are frequently held here and it is said to be good luck for the groom to carry his bride up the 99 steps leading to the entrance, before ringing the bell inside the church and making a wish.

LAKE BLED

The traditional method of accessing Bled Island is via a wooden boat known as a pletna, decorated with colourful awnings and similar in style to a Venetian gondola.

It is possible to walk a complete circuit of the lake along accessible paths and there are several places to take a dip into the cool water. Alternatively, scaling the Ojstrica viewpoint gives amazing views over the lake and landscape. Cycling around the lake is a popular activity and hiring a bike is possible. Or take a more relaxed pace, enjoying a Slovenian pastry at a lakeside cafe.



Located in the heart of the old town, this hotel offers an authentic Albanian experience. The hotel has a large restaurant and bar with an outdoor terrace. Rooms are traditionally decorated with wooden panelling and Ottoman-style furnishings. En-suite rooms are air conditioned.

HOTEL BRILANT, SARANDË

ALBANIA THROUGH THE AGES

TIRANA BERAT SARANDË VLORË KRUJË 8 days /7 nights from £999



iscover the UNESCO-listed fortified city of B

Hidden in the south-eastern corner of the Balkan Peninsula, Albania remains somewhat of a mystery compared to neighbouring countries in the region.

Begin by exploring the bustling capital city of Tirana, discovering the country's recent communist history and the impact this had on the population. Journey south to the historical cities of Berat and Gjirokastër to witness the stone architecture of the traditional Ottoman houses. Enter medieval churches decorated with intricate and mesmerising iconography. Continue south to the laidback coastal city of Sarandë, surrounded by pristine white-sand beaches lapped by the warm waters of the Adriatic and Ionian Seas. Explore the ancient Roman and Greek ruins of Butrint and Apollonia, rich in culture and history and with immaculately well-preserved structures.

Then travel the length of the Albanian Riviera flanked by beautiful coastal waters, impressive towering mountains and dense pine forests. Stroll along the promenade of Vlorë and spend the evening in the recently renovated pastel-hued old town. Spot flamingos and pelicans whilst visiting the unique Zvernec lagoon monastery. End your tour in the mountains of Krujë overlooking the vast valley below.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Wed) Fly to Tirana, capital of Albania, where you are transferred to your hotel (1 night).

Day 2 (Thu) Tirana - Berat In the morning, take a tour of Tirana for your first introduction to Albania. Visit Bunk'Art 1, a nuclear bunker built into a mountain by the communist government, to learn about life under the regime. In the afternoon, take a scenic two-hour journey to the ancient city of Berat, arriving in the early evening (2 nights).

Day 3 (Fri) Berat A half-day walking tour of the UNESCO world heritage city of Berat. The town can be separated into three distinct areas; the Kalaja, or castle, which stands proud over the valley; and the residential areas of Mangalemi and Gorica below. Learn about the history of the 2,400-year-old town as you walk through the warrenlike alleyways, stopping at the Church of the Dormition of St Mary with incredible examples of Orthodox iconography by the famous 16th century painter Onufri. Views are fabulous from atop the Kalaja with the most impressive being the viewpoint overlooking the town. Enjoy the rest of the afternoon at leisure to cross the river and explore the area of Gorica or relax in one of the many cafes along the promenade.

Day 4 (Sat) Berat - Sarandë An early departure to Gjirokastër with beautiful views en-route, including glimpses of the Adriatic Sea. Said to be one of Albania's most attractive towns, the tour of Gjirokastër will take you through the heart of the Old Town where the distinct Ottoman architecture is displayed. A visit to the vast fortress gives beautiful views of the town and surrounding valley. Enjoy some free time for lunch before continuing your journey to Sarandë on the Adriatic Coast, where you have free time to stroll along the promenade and, perhaps, sample some of the fresh seafood (2 nights).

Day 5 (Sun) Sarandë A morning tour of the nearby ancient archaeological ruins of Butrint. Discover the history of the site with remnants of ancient Greek, Roman, Byzantine, Venetian and other eras sprawled across the vast national park. In the afternoon relax at the nearby Ksamil Beach with inviting turquoise waters and views out to the Greek Island of Corfu.

Day 6 (Mon) Sarandë - Vlorë Drive along the Albanian Riviera to Vlorë, the Albanian city of independence. You stop at the Venetian Fort of Ali Pasha and the Llogara Pass, with breath-taking views. After lunch (included), take a dip in the Ionian Sea at one of the spectacular white-sand beaches en route, before arriving in the early evening (1 night).

Day 7 (Tue) Vlorë - Krujë Start with a visit to the nearby island monastery of Zvernec, situated in the Narta Lagoon, where pelicans and flamingoes can often be spotted. Continue to the ruins of Apollonia with iconic ancient Greek architecture, established in 600 BC. After lunch (included), travel northwards for two hours to the Ottoman hill-town of Krujë, arriving in the early evening (1 night).

Day 8 (Wed) For your final morning, perhaps explore the bazaar where authentic Balkan handicrafts can be purchased, or visit the Skanderbeg Museum or National Ethnographic Museum housed in the walls of the castle. Then take a transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK.





BUTRINT NATIONAL PARK

Albania boasts some incredible historical sites, and perhaps the most impressive of all are the UNESCOlisted archaeological ruins of the ancient city of Butrint, located a short distance south of Sarandë. Strategically located on the eastern part of the Strait of Corfu, the city was built across a peninsula that is surrounded by Lake Butrint, with channels that connect it to the Ionian Sea.

The history of this fascinating site spans some 2,500 years and the influence of ancient Greek, Roman, Byzantine and other eras can easily be seen throughout the 29 square kilometre park.

Key sites of interest that show off the iconic architecture of the various inhabitants of the city include the immaculately well-preserved Roman amphitheatre, the ornate archways of the Grand Basilica and the intricate mosaics of the Baptistery. The site also has two castles; one overlooking the Vivari Channel and another unique triangular Venetian Castle that guards the main entrance to the site.

Aside from the rich historical significance, Butrint is also an important conservation area with a large number of animal and plant species including the golden eagle, the national symbol of Albania.

HIGHLIGHTS OF TRANSYLVANIA

BUCHAREST BRASOV SIBIU CARPATHIAN MOUNTAINS 7 DAYS / 6 NIGHTS FROM £1149



A mysterious land of medieval villages, Gothic castles, legends of vampires, fortified churches, and brown bears roaming the mighty Carpathian Mountains, Romania is like stepping into a fairytale.

Transylvania is home to some of Europe's best preserved medieval towns, most notably Brasov, featuring old Saxon architecture and citadel ruins; Sibiu, with its cobblestone streets and pastel-coloured houses; and Sighisoara, adorned with a hilltop citadel, secret passageways and a 14th century clock tower. There are also 150 well-preserved Saxon fortified churches dotted around the region, some dating from the 13th century.

There is no shortage of jaw-dropping castles pitched precariously on rocky hilltops. The most famous is Bran Castle, a mythical Gothic structure associated with the legend of Dracula, while the most picturesque is the stunning Peles Castle, a fairytale royal castle nestled at the foot of the Bucegi Mountains.

End in the capital city of Bucharest with its striking architecture, historical buildings and cobbled Old Town.

From its dark communist history in Bucharest to its Saxon, Ottoman and Hungarian influences in Transylvania, there is so much to be discovered in each location on this trip.

Day 1 (Tue) Bucharest Fly from the UK to Bucharest, capital of Romania. Transfer to your hotel (1 night).

Day 2 (Wed) Bucharest - Brasov An early departure for the drive towards Transylvania. First, visit the picturesque Sinaia Monastery and Peles Castle, built in the neo-Renaissance style and teeming with the finest European artwork inside. Peles Castle was the summer residence of the Romanian Royal Family until 1947. After lunch, included at a local restaurant, continue to Bran Castle, more commonly known as Dracula's Castle, for a guided tour. Exploring the castle transports you into an atmospheric world of mystery; wander down creaky-floored corridors, wind up narrow spiral staircases and enter vast rooms adorned with huge oil paintings and intricately carved antique furniture. In the early evening, arrive into the charming city of Brasov encircled by the Carpathian Mountains (2 nights).

Day 3 (Thu) Brasov In the morning, take the optional Carpathian Mountain Bear Sanctuary excursion. Spend the afternoon exploring Brasov on a walking tour and learn about the city's medieval history. Visit its superbly preserved Gothic church and wander through ornate pedestrianised streets and past pastel-coloured baroque buildings dating from the late Middle Ages.

Day 4 (Fri) Brasov - Sibiu Leave Brasov behind and first stop in the rural Saxon village of Viscri, whose Lutheran church forms part of the Villages with Fortified Churches in Transylvania UNESCO World Heritage Site. Viscri has a famous admirer in the Prince of Wales, who fought to stop the Communist destruction of Romania's traditional villages. Have free time for lunch in the beautiful city of Sighisoara, famed for its bright-coloured buildings, cobbled

alleys and medieval towers. Adjacent to the 14th century Clock Tower is the birthplace of Vlad the Impaler, which you can visit. The last stop is the Saxon village of Biertan. Surrounded by rolling hills and vineyards, the 15th century Biertan Fortified Church is perched on a hill overlooking the quaint village. Arrive into Sibiu in the evening, the final Transylvanian city on the tour (2 nights).

Day 5 (Sat) Sibiu A morning walking tour of the 12th century Saxon city of Sibiu, affectionately dubbed 'The City With Eyes'. Owing to the unique window vents that adorn many of the houses on the south and east sides of the city, these cartoonish features create the illusion that the houses are watching you. Sibiu also exhibits a diverse vet elegant architecture representing late Renaissance, early Gothic, classical and Transylvanian baroque. Starting from the Big Square, marvel at the Old Town's colourful buildings, defensive walls, towers and historical cathedrals. Enjoy the afternoon and evening at leisure.

Day 6 (Sun) Sibiu - Bucharest A long drive through the Olt Valley back to the capital. On the way, stop at Cozia Monastery, a medieval monastic complex, and have lunch (included). In the late afternoon arrive in Bucharest where there is a photo stop at the Palace of Parliament, the heaviest building in the world. Enjoy the evening at leisure where you can further wander around the bustling Old Town (1 night).

Day 7 (Mon) After breakfast, enjoy a short walking tour of Bucharest's Old Town. Explore the cobbled streets of the historic Lipscani Street and visit the Old Princely Court, the residence of Vlad the Impaler. In the afternoon, transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK.





A SHORT HISTORY OF THE BALTICS

The Baltic States have a varied and chequered past, with power over the three countries constantly changing hands over the centuries. This has served to create a unique history which can only be fully understood when exploring each destination.

During the 14th-16th centuries, Lithuania had a powerful empire that dominated much of Eastern Europe before becoming part of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth which lasted until the end of the 18th century. In contrast, Latvia and Estonia both have historical ties to Germany and Sweden, with the former's capital of Riga first founded by Germans at the turn of the 13th century. By the 19th century all three countries were controlled by the Russian Empire.

Lithuania and Latvia first gained independence in 1918 when they broke away from the German Empire after the First World War, with Estonia following suit in 1920. Unfortunately, this period of relative stability in the Baltic States was interrupted with the onset of the Second World War, when Nazi Germany and the Soviet Union repeatedly contested for dominance over the states, with Germany taking power in 1941 before the Soviets captured the area in 1944. Soviet rule remained in place for nearly half a century until the fall of the Soviet Union in 1991.

Each of the states rebelled against Soviet rule in different way. In Lithuania, the Hill of Crosses was erected as a symbol of protest against the atheist views of the Soviet Union and remains a strong reminder of the harsh conditions that were endured. The site has become a place of pilgrimage not only for Lithuanians but for practicing Christians all over Europe.

In Estonia, the weapon of choice was music and the power of song, with the five-year Singing Revolution resulting in the country's independence. This spirit of song has become a lasting tradition in the country and each year the Song Festival Grounds welcome more than 30,000 singers and an audience of 80,000 people.

In 1989, as a show of peaceful public demonstration against occupation, 2 million citizens of the Baltic States formed a continuous human chain covering 600km from Vilnius to Riga to Tallinn which become known as the Baltic Way. Following this act of defiance Lithuania became the first state to be granted independence.







After a two-hour drive, arrive at you desert camp, with time for lunch, then board a pickup truck for an exciting drive through the lunar-like landscape of the desert made famous by the tales of Lawrence of Arabia. Before you return to your camp, your driver will stop at a vantage point overlooking the desert. Here, you can witness the changing colours of the desert as the sun dips below the horizon. You arrive back at the camp in the early evening where you enjoy a typical Bedouin meal with entertainment and great stargazing opportunities (1 night).

Day 6 (Sat) Wadi Rum - Dead Sea Perhaps rise early to view the sunrise over Wadi Rum, then depart the desert camp and take a two-and-a-half hour drive to the Dana biosphere, where you take a gentle 2km walk with opportunities of spotting unique flora and fauna. Have lunch (included) in the historic stone village of Dana with views out over the canyon before continuing to the Dead Sea, arriving in the evening (2 nights).

Day 7 (Sun) Dead Sea Enjoy a relaxed day at the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth. Take a dip in the supersalty water and feel the sense of weightlessness as you bob on the surface of the sea. Perhaps relax at your hotel or take a spa treatment.

Day 8 (Mon) An early morning transfer from your hotel to Amman airport for your return flight to the UK.





Be enraptured by the atmosphere of this iconic site after dusk and let your mind wander back in time. With incredible photo opportunities, this is the perfect way to first witness the sheer beauty of Petra. Entrance to Petra by Night opens at 20:30 and lasts for two hours, finishing at 22:30.





A BRIEF HISTORY OF PETRA

Standing at the crossroads between Arabia, Egypt and Syria-Phoenicia, the ancient Nabataean city of Petra, inhabited as early as the 4th Century BC, became a major caravan-centre for the trading in items such as Arabian incense, silk from China and spices from India.

The city itself has been half-carved and half-built into the rock of the desert and is surrounded by mountains with natural passages and gorges. The Nabataeans were ingenious architects and engineered a water management systems of canals and irrigation tunnels that were cut into the rose-red rock that turned a naturally arid region


into a prosperous and flourishing city. At the height of Petra's power, in the 1st century AD, these technologies allowed a population of 20,000 people to reside in the desert with a continuous flurry of visitors following the trade routes.

With the introduction of sea trade routes, Petra's importance began to decline, and by 106 AD the Romans had invaded and forced a surrender, ruling over the city until the 4th century AD when an earthquake struck. The Byzantines then took power, however, by the start of the 8th century AD, Petra was largely abandoned.

MOROCCO'S IMPERIAL CITIES

Marrakech, Rabat, Fes and Meknes are the four most historical and important cities of Morocco. Collectively known as the imperial cities, each has at one point served as the capital of the country and, as such, has played a pivotal role in its history and development. With incredible sites of importance, unique characteristics and charms it is well worthwhile exploring each city.

Perhaps the most well known of the four, Marrakech, also affectionately called the 'Red City', is a feast for the senses. The 70 metre minaret of the Koutoubia Mosque dominates the skyline and stands proud over the main square of Djemaa el Fna, which comes to life as the sun sets and a temporary city of foodstalls is erected nightly. The bustling souk of the medina evokes the true essence of Morocco.

The current capital, Rabat, sits on the Atlantic coast and has maintained a rich cultural identity. The most impressive site is the city's 12th century Hassan Tower and the Mausoleum of Mohammed V. The 200 columns dotted around the Hassan Tower are the remains of the unfinished mosque. The king resides here and, overall, the city has the feel of a small seaside town with wide boulevards influenced by the colonial-French rule of the early 20th century.

The oldest of Morocco's imperial cities, Fes is the spiritual heart of the country. The city houses the world's oldest university, the Al Quaraouiyine Mosque, and the world's oldest medieval medina, dating back to the 9th century, which also holds the title of the world's largest pedestrianised urban centre. Exploring the winding lanes of the medina feels like stepping back in time.

The least known of the imperial cities, Meknes symbolizes the power of Sultan Moulay Ismail who made the city the capital of Morocco in the 17th century. It retains an authentic charm with a more relaxed medina full of vibrant markets. The city showcases the power of the Sultan in such sites as the elaborately decorated Bab el-Mansour gate and the massive imperial palace complex endowed with extensive fortifications.

Where one person in a party cancels and others still wish to travel, single room supplements will be payable if this results in single rooms being used.

5. Alterations or cancellations by us

We make careful arrangements with airlines, hotels and service operators to ensure that we are able to provide you with the holiday as described. However, in exceptional cases, it may be necessary to make changes to your holiday arrangements (including airlines, flights, accommodation, transport or services) due to circumstances beyond our control. Flight times are given only as indications, and finalised times will be shown on your tickets.

When changes are necessary, we will do our best to ensure that they do not affect your holiday. If, before you depart, a major change is necessary (defined as a change of itinerary so that you are no longer able to visit a destination where you are scheduled to spend one or more nights or an appropriate alternative destination, or a change of accommodation to a lower standard or category affecting a significant part of your holiday) or if we have to cancel your holiday, we will contact you and offer you the choice of:

Accepting the changes to your holiday;
Purchasing another available Llama Travel holiday;
Cancelling your holiday with a full refund.

If we have to cancel your holiday less than 60 days before departure, other than in the event of force majeure (see section 6 below), you will be entitled to compensation at the following levels: *When notified Compensation*

6. Alterations or cancellations by you or us in the event of force majeure

If, prior to departure, we have to make major changes to, or cancel, your holiday in the event of force majeure, we will contact you and offer you the above choices. However, compensation will not be paid.

If, in the event of force majeure, it is not possible for your holiday to proceed, we will endeavour to recover from suppliers, and refund to you, monies paid for your holiday, but where we are unable to do so, you may be able to claim for irrecoverable costs from your travel insurance. We do not accept liability where the performance of our contractual obligations is prevented by force majeure.

Force majeure events include war, threat of war, civil unrest or strife, decisions by governments or governing authorities, epidemic, natural disasters, fire, bad weather, terrorist activity, nuclear disaster, industrial disputes, technical or maintenance problems with transport, changes of timetables of airlines, or other causes beyond our control.

7. Minimum group size

Most holidays can operate with a minimum of 2 passengers, but some holidays have a higher minimum group size. If we have fewer than the minimum number of passengers, we will let you know two months before departure. In this case, we will refund you any monies paid or offer you an alternative option. No compensation will be paid. 8. Our responsibilities to you

Llama Travel is dedicated to ensuring that your holiday is as described. If a part of your holiday is not provided as promised, please inform us at the time. If this affects the reasonable enjoyment of your holiday, we will pay compensation appropriate to the circumstances. If you do not inform us at the time, Llama Travel accepts no responsibility for the situation as we will not have been given the opportunity to rectify the problem. Llama Travel accepts responsibility for illness, personal injury or death caused as a direct result of the negligence of our employees or suppliers while acting in the course of their employment to provide services or arrangements for your holiday that you have booked with us in the UK. We do not accept responsibility for illness, personal injury or death where there has been no fault of our employees, agents, suppliers or sub-contractors, or as a result of taking part in any activity which does not form part of the holiday booked through us in the UK. Where illness, personal injury or death arises in the course of air travel, rail travel, sea travel or hotel accommodation, the amount of compensation you may receive is limited in accordance with the provisions of any International Convention.

9. Your responsibilities

Clients are responsible for ensuring that all immigration and health requirements are fulfilled, for obtaining travel documents, including passports, visas and vaccination certificates, and for ensuring that these are all in order, including for any intermediate stops on international flights. Covid-19 requirements are updated frequently in all countries and you must ensure that you comply with these in the UK, in destinations visited and in any intermediary stops. You must comply with local regulations regarding prevention measures which may be stricter than in the UK. Non-compliance may result in you being excluded from the holiday with no refund. You must not travel if you are required to isolate by health authorities and standard cancellation terms will apply. If you are required to isolate when on holiday, you will not be entitled to a refund for unused services, including flights. You accept the risks of catching covid-19, being required to isolate or be tested and we recommend you have suitable travel insurance to cover such circumstances.

We require your passport details to issue some tickets. If these change after you have given them to us, you must inform us. If the name on your airline ticket does not match that on your passport, you must inform us as soon as you receive the ticket.

It is your responsibility to behave in a responsible, restrained and sober manner when dealing with local authorities, fellow travellers and our representatives.

By taking a Llama Travel holiday, you agree to accept the authority and decisions of our employees and representatives. If, in the opinion of such people, your behaviour or health is likely to threaten the safety, comfort or progress of a tour, then you may be excluded from the tour without refund or compensation. It is your responsibility to obey local laws, otherwise you may be excluded from the holiday and we will cease to have any responsibility for you.

Please bear in mind that travel to Llama Travel destinations is not the same as travel in the UK, and inconveniences and delays may arise due to weather conditions, strikes, demonstrations, the poor state of roads or for other reasons. By travelling with Llama Travel, you are implicitly accepting this part of the way of life in these countries.

10. Flights

We have no control over international or national air carriers, and therefore schedules or airlines used may change or flights be delayed due to no fault of our own. A change of flight time or airline due to schedule changes or flight cancellations is not treated as a major change. We will try to ensure the smooth flow of all your transport connections, but it is your responsibility to check exact times of flights. This is particularly important for internal flights, which can be rescheduled at short notice. Llama Travel accepts no responsibility for the consequences of flights missed due to the client's failure to confirm exact details.

When you travel with an airline, the Conditions of Carriage of that airline apply, some of which will limit or exclude liability. These conditions are the subject of International Agreements between countries.

It is your responsibility to arrive at the departure airport at the appropriate time and to check in for your international flight, and to change aeroplanes if necessary

at intermediate airports. If you wish to sit in a specific seat, or wish to sit with other people on the flight, it is recommended that you check in early or check in online where possible. It is sometimes possible to reserve seats directly with the airline online prior to travel.

Airlines do not allow more than one booking per passenger on a flight and may cancel seats if they are held by more than one operator. Clients are responsible for ensuring they are not holding flights with another operator.

11. Baggage allowance

Most airlines have a baggage allowance of 20kg per passenger, or sometimes less. Carrying excess baggage will normally incur an expensive additional cost payable at check in. Additionally, certain excursions have a limited baggage allowance. Where this is the case, you will usually be able to leave the rest of you luggage in storage. Llama Travel accepts no responsibility for the delay, loss or damage of luggage. **12. Insurance**

You must have adequate insurance provision to cover the cost of assistance, including emergency repatriation, in the event of illness or other problems occurring during your holiday.

13. Complaints

If you have any complaints about your holiday arrangements when you are abroad, please bring these to the attention of our local representatives who will do all they can to ensure a swift and satisfactory resolution. Problems can usually be sorted out by talking to the supplier concerned (e.g. hotel) and our local representatives or by informing us directly. If this is not done, Llama Travel accepts no responsibility for the situation, as we will not have been given the opportunity to rectify the problem. If you do not inform us, your consumer rights to compensation may be affected. If you have tried and failed to rectify the situation whilst abroad, please send us your complaint in writing within 28 days of returning to the UK. We will then follow up your complaint. Communication with destinations is often slow, so we may not be able to resolve the situation as quickly as you would like.

14. Financial protection for bookings made in UK for UK residents

The holidays in this brochure are ATOL protected, since we hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority, number ATOL 5804. If we, or the suppliers identified on your ATOL certificate, are unable to provide the services listed (or a suitable alternative, through an alternative ATOL holder or otherwise) for reasons of insolvency, the Trustees of the Air Travel Trust may make a payment to (or confer a benefit on) you under the ATOL scheme. You agree that in return for such a payment or benefit you assign absolutely to those Trustees any claims which you have or may have arising out of or relating to the non-provision of the services, including any claim against us, the travel agent (or your credit card issuer where applicable). You also agree that any such claims may be re-assigned to another body, if that other body has paid sums you have claimed under the ATOL scheme.

15. Brochure and website information

The information in our brochures and on our website is, to the best of our knowledge, correct at the time of going to press. However, details of flights or hotels may vary during the lifetime of a brochure. These changes will be reflected on our website where possible.

The copyright on all material in our brochures and on our website, including text, photographs, maps and layouts is held by Llama Travel Limited. No part of these publications may be reproduced, stored or transmitted in any way without the prior written permission of Llama Travel.

16. Data Protection

The information we ask you to provide, including personal information about you and members of your party, is necessary for us to arrange and operate your holiday. By booking a holiday with us, you agree to our processing this information, including, where appropriate, its transfer outside of the UK.

How to Book

To book a holiday or discuss your requirements, please call us on 020 7263 3000. We can usually confirm availability immediately, but may need to check with a supplier first.

Payment

There is no charge for bank transfers or cheques, or for deposits on UK debit cards or standard UK Visa and MasterCard credit cards. Balance payments can be made by cheque or bank transfer only. We are unable to accept cash. Our bank details are: Llama Travel Ltd, Account No: 40738998, Sort Code 09-06-66.

What's included in the price

Prices are based on two persons sharing a room and include all flights, transfers and accommodation.

Where applicable, entrance fees, taxes and charges are included in our prices at the rates advised to us at the time of preparation. An adjustment will be made to your price if any of these change before your holiday. **Passports and Visas**

Visas are not required in advance for British citizens for any Llama Travel destination in Europe or Morocco. The Jordan visa is included in the price of your holiday. For British passports endorsed in any way and all other passports, please ask the appropriate consulate. You need a full 10 year passport valid for 6 months after your return to the UK, and which was issued less than 10 years prior to the date of your return.

If children are not travelling with both parents, some countries require a letter of consent to enter or depart. Please consult the appropriate consulate.

To issue some tickets, we require passport details and ages when you book. If you subsequently change your passport, please let us know as soon as possible. **Hotel grading**

Official hotel ratings vary from country to country. Our standard hotels are comfortable tourist class hotels. More details on each hotel can be found on our website.

Hotel rooms

If you have a preference for a twin or a double room, please let us know. However, we cannot guarantee this as many hotels do not allocate rooms until the day of arrival. Despite costing more per person, single rooms do not always offer the same level of comfort as doubles. Some hotel bathrooms have showers instead of baths. If you prefer a bath, please ask. If you arrive at a hotel before check-in time, your room may not be ready. You will be able to use the hotel facilities until your room is ready. Check out time is usually in the late morning. A charge is normally made for late check out.

Tickets and vouchers

You will receive tickets approximately 10 days before departure, along with information on accommodation, transfers and excursions. Our agents in destination will give you any other documentation when you arrive. Please check airline tickets carefully in case timings have changed after we issued your confirmation.

Excursions and Extensions

Excursions are operated together with other holidaymakers. These will usually be in English, although groups are sometimes a mix of English and other languages. A minimum of 2 people is required for some excursions. On some occasions, the order of excursions may vary.

Insurance

Adequate travel insurance is essential. We do not sell or recommend any specific policy. A list of insurance companies that our customers have found suitable is available from us. Please advise your insurer of any pre-existing medical conditions and, if you are booking a holiday involving any activities, make sure that you are covered for these. Note that cancellation cover is often only available if insurance is purchased at the time of booking your holiday.

Age and fitness limitations

For most of our holidays, age is not a concern. However, a reasonable level of fitness is required, as most holidays require some walking, sometimes on uneven ground.

Health and vaccinations

Please consult your GP or a travel clinic about health and vaccination requirements. Advice for travellers is available at www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk. Yellow Fever certificates are sometimes required if you have recently visited a country with an infected area.

Covid-19 entry requirements are updated frequently. Please check government travel advice for the latest information.

When travelling, stomach illnesses are not uncommon due to changes in diet. For some countries, we suggest you only drink bottled or filtered water and avoid ice in drinks. If you are unsure if salads and fruit have been washed in purified water, it is best to avoid them.

If you suffer from a disability or condition and are worried whether this will affect the enjoyment of a holiday, please call us. We will do our best to help. We recommend that you bring any medicines you require from the UK.

Outside of major cities, medical facilities can be basic, meaning a lengthy transfer if hospital attention is required.

Your safety and security

Most people who travel to the countries where Llama Travel operates experience no problems on holiday. However, as is the case anywhere in the world, crime can be a problem, especially in large cities. Tourists can appear attractive targets to criminals. To minimise the risk, use common sense. Do not display signs of wealth, such as expensive looking jewellery or cameras. Avoid empty streets, especially on your own. Take a taxi after dark. By taking sensible precautions, you should have a trouble-free holiday.

Each country has its own standards for health and safety, but these are often not as good as in the UK. We take this into account when selecting hotels and request that they comply with local regulations, but cannot guarantee that these are equivalent to British standards. Please take reasonable precautions to protect yourselves whilst on holiday, e.g. by locating fire exit routes.


